ORDER

It has been conceded by the Registrar PMDC that certain students have qualified to be admitted to the various colleges in public sector, however due to departmental delay their admission could not be made within time. In light of the above, we do not find that those students who have qualified on merits can be deprived of their educational rights on account of lethargy and delay of the government institution including if any of the Higher Education Commission. Therefore, we direct that all the students named in the list provided by the Registrar PMDC which is placed on the record as Mark-A must be admitted to medical colleges against which they have applied within a period of one week with a report to this Court for perusal in Chambers. The fee and scholarship shall be paid by the Higher Education Commission as per the decision and rules already in vogue. Re-list.
